

## Scholarships & Grants

TIPENE provides this document which outlines a diverse selection of scholarships and grants to reduce obstacles that may hinder Taura opportunities or progress.

### TIPENE Administered Scholarships 1-5.

#### 1.SSQVSTB Donation

The *St Stephen's and Queen Victoria Schools Trust Board (SSQVSTB)* is committing to a donation of \$5,000 for all successful **2025 and 2026 taura** selected to attend TIPENE. The following conditions apply:

- Taura must complete a full year at TIPENE;
- A good level of study application is required;
- Motivation to work hard in and out of the classroom is evident;
- Serious misconduct is grounds for the withdrawal of this donation.

Amount: **\$5,000 for 2025 and/or 2026**



#### 2. Hori Waewae Scholarship

The *Hori Waewae Scholarship* is awarded to **two taura** to the value of **\$3,500** for one year. George Foote (a St Stephens School Alumni) and his whānau have indicated they wish Te Tuara Trust (TIPENE Tumuaki) to select the taura and administer the resource. Five broad criteria for selection are that taura;

1. be of good character;
2. be ambitious about advancing his education;
3. have been shown to have academic ability;
4. need financial support.
5. must complete a full year at TIPENE.



#### 3. The Brian Simpson Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship has been established by the daughters of the late Brian Simpson (a St Stephens School Alumni) and is worth **\$2,500 per annum**. *The Brian Simpson Memorial Scholarship* expects that all applicants will;

- Be connected to, or living within the Mataatua Rohe;
- Demonstrate leadership and potential;
- Have academic ability;
- Demonstrate sporting capability;
- Commit to Te Reo and Tikanga;
- Be of good character;
- Be able to demonstrate financial need, and;
- Benefit from attending TIPENE.



#### **4. Ports of Auckland Taura Herenga Waka Scholarship**

This scholarship is called the ‘*Port of Auckland Taura Herenga Waka Scholarship*’. This name relates to the Port Māori Outcomes Framework “the rope that binds the waka.” The Port of Auckland is proud to confirm an educational scholarship to the **value of \$10,000 per annum** for TIPENE. The intended purpose of the scholarship is to support taura to achieve their potential through education. The scholarship is to be awarded to between **one to four taura** via Te Tuara Trust (TIPENE Tumuaki) who reside in, or whakapapa to, Tamaki Makaurau (19 iwi as recognised by the Auckland City Council) and/or Tainui.



#### **5. Tumuaki Scholarship Fund (*Te Rauhitanga o te Mano o TIPENE*)**

Aware that for many whānau payment of fees can be very challenging.

Te Rauhitanga o te Mano o TIPENE (SSOBA) provides significant funding support through the Tumaki Scholarship Fund to the value of **\$20,000** for taura fees.

This fund is placed in the Te Tuara Trust account and administered by the Tumuaki to ensure taura in need of financial assistance are recipients of the Te Rauhitanga o te Mano o TIPENE scholarship fund.

The scholarship fund is offered for **1 year**.

Tumuaki will select between **one to four** deserving taura each year as recipients of this scholarship.

**The following scholarships are external to TIPENE and require you to make a direct application for consideration.**

### **Ministry of Education Boarding Allowance**

A boarding allowance can help ākonga living in remote areas or facing significant barriers to their education, board away from home. A barrier is a circumstance that is preventing ākonga from achieving in and attending school. Parents or caregivers apply for this allowance and funding is paid directly to the school.

Eligibility: For both Māori and Pākehā students.

Tenure: For a three-year approved secondary school course
